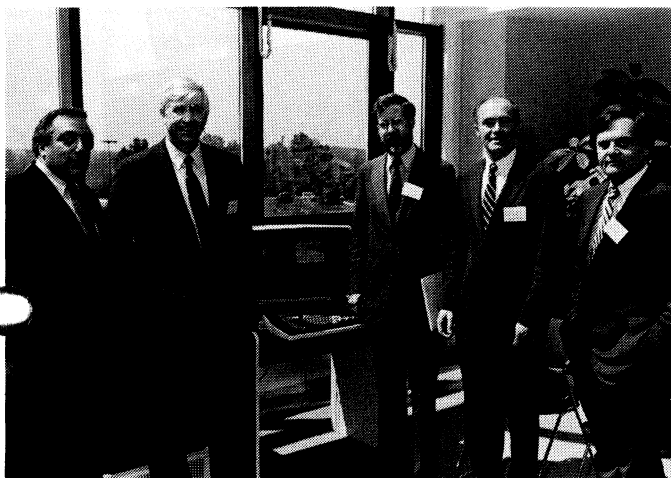

CNEC Receives Equipment Donation From Data General

A \$500,000 equipment donation by Data General will allow Central New England College (CNEC) to develop several new programs of study. Programs in computer-aided design (CAD) and data processing using Data General's CEO Comprehensive Electronic Office software will be implemented.

The gift, an ECLIPSE MV/10000 system and 32 terminals will also be used to develop a pilot program to train 900 Massachusetts elementary and secondary public school teachers in computer technology.

"I know of no other institution of higher education in Massachusetts that has formulated a complete computer literacy training program for teachers at no charge," says CNEC President Edward Mattar.

Computers are a necessary tool in the classroom. It is our responsibility as educators to train our counterparts in the public schools to use the computer so that they and their students can benefit from it."

According to Edward, enthusiasm for computers in the classroom remains overwhelmingly high. Central New England College is going to harness that enthusiasm and provide teachers an opportunity to update their literacy sufficiently so computers, if not currently, will become an integral part of classroom instruction.

CNEC's training program is open to all state elementary and secondary school teachers. Participants will register for the program on a first-come, first-serve basis and will be asked to get an endorsement from their school superintendent or principal. The program is scheduled to begin in early July.

Data General is well aware of the importance of assisting local educational institutions. For more than a year, the company has been conducting a program in which about 100 educators from school systems throughout New England have been trained in the power and uses of computers. During the five-day sessions, held once a month at Southboro, instructors and superintendents have been brought through keyboard instruction, electronic mail capabilities, word processing, programming and other features that are needed to help implement computer training in the school classroom.

Second Donation

"This donation will allow the college to explore program opportunities that are not possible with our current equipment configuration," says Edward. The ECLIPSE MV/10000 has two-and-a-half times more memory than the college's present mainframe computer, according to Edward. "This system is a compatible upward extension of the ECLIPSE MV/4000, the college received as a donation a year ago," Edward says.

This equipment means substantial upgrading of the college's Management Information Systems (MIS) center. Plans are underway for the installation of an eight-ton air conditioning system and extensive communications equipment that will allow the equipment to be used at the college's Westboro campus.

"This kind of support from local high-tech companies is an invaluable contribution to the educational process," remarks Edward. "It is an endorsement of the work we do."

"If students are to be prepared for careers in business, there must be some natural relationship between education and industry," says Data General President Ed de Castro. "Neither can prosper without the support of the other. The computer industry is fueled by brain power."

"The ultimate capability of the high technology industry is only limited by the imagination of the people working within the industry. And industry support of higher education is more than just a charitable contribution, but an investment in resource development," Ed says.

CNEC, with campuses in downtown Worcester, as well as in Westboro, is the only college in New England where the majority of its student body, 52 percent, study computer science.

Data General Allowed To Land At Westboro

Data General has been allowed, by a decision of the Worcester Superior Court, to land a helicopter at corporate headquarters at 4400 Computer Drive. The company's six-passenger helicopter will be allowed to leave from and land in the area adjacent to the visitor's parking area.

Data General filed suit to overturn a December 17 vote in which the Westboro Zoning Board of Appeals denied a special permit for the Westboro facility. The Town of Westboro has 30 days from May 27, the day the court rendered its decision, to appeal.

Data General To Supply Technology To Cobra Of Brazil

Data General and Cobra Computadores e Sistemas Brasileiros S/A of Rio de Janeiro have entered into a technical support and technology supply agreement allowing Cobra to now manufacture, sell and service 32-bit computer systems, its new Model 1000 Series, based on Data General ECLIPSE MV architecture.

With the addition of Data General's ECLIPSE MV/4000 and MV/8000 II technology and components to its line of commercial, governmental and scientific computer systems, Cobra expects sales of several hundred million dollars through the end of the decade.

For Cobra the agreement will play an important role in his company's ability to maintain its leadership in supplying minicomputer systems to the Brazilian market. The company expects to begin shipments of its new 32-bit Cobra 1200 and Cobra 1400 models to customers in October.

Founded in 1974, Cobra is Brazil's largest manufacturer of eight- and 16-bit computer systems; the company maintains approximately 40 sales and service offices throughout the country and employs some 2500 people.

"Our agreement with Cobra is of strategic importance to both companies," says Wayne Fitzsimmons, vice president for Americas/Far East. "It provides Cobra with industry-leading minicomputer technology, important to winning new accounts and to serving the growing computer needs of its existing customer base. It also allows Data General to participate significantly in a large and rapidly growing market through an established and highly regarded Brazilian firm."

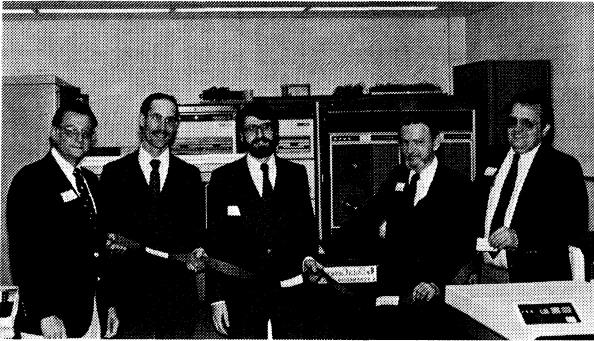
Gift For Mendon-Upton Regional School Students

Powerful Superminicomputer Donated To Air Force Academy

The Air Force Academy has received the donation of a powerful superminicomputer system, valued at more than \$500,000, from Data General.

The Data General ECLIPSE MV/10000 system, which has been installed at Fairchild Hall, will be used for research, development and instructional purposes. More than 300 students in the computer science program will use the equipment each semester.

The Academy also received Data General's Ada Development Environment (ADE) software that allows programs to be written in the Ada computer language. Ada has been mandated by the Department of Defense for use in all military-embedded systems and mission critical software.

"This donation will give cadets at the Academy the opportunity to work with one of the industry's most powerful computers and, at the same time, learn programming skills using Ada, an extremely sophisticated computer language," says Larry Holswade, vice president and general manager of Data General's Federal Systems Division.

The new equipment will also be used by faculty members who are doing research in Ada, software engineering and embedded computers, as well as in classes attended by personnel from Air Force agencies such as Space Command and Systems Command.

"The Air Force Academy has been a leader in the development of Ada and Ada training programs,"

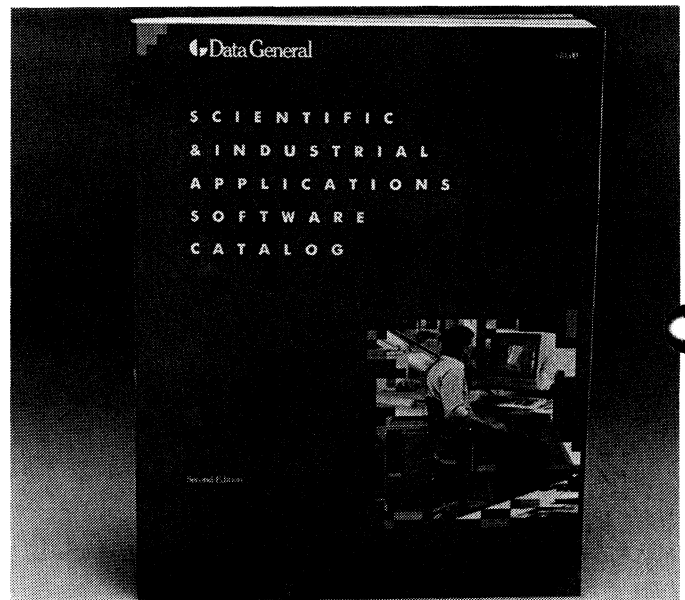
says Larry. "This donation will help the Academy further expand its efforts with Ada using the most technologically-advanced computer equipment."

The 32-bit ECLIPSE MV/10000 system has eight megabytes of main memory and an on-line storage capacity of 708 megabytes of memory.

The ADE software is based on Data General's Ada compiler, the first production quality Ada software compiler to be validated by the Department of Defense.

The donation is one of more than 30 made to educational institutions by Data General in the past year. During the last six months the company has donated computer hardware and software valued at more than \$10 million to universities and colleges throughout the nation.

New ISV Catalog Published

The Technical Products Division (TPD) recently published its new Independent Software Vendor catalog, complete with several new application solutions which have nearly doubled the number of entries in the catalog to 533. The ISV catalog lists the different scientific and industrial automation titles running on Data General's wide range of computer systems.

Among the additions are computer-aided design/computer-aided manufacturing; manufacturing/industrial control; electronic; architectural; and engineering and construction application solutions.

The 330-page catalog is produced as part of Data General's Independent Software Vendor program, which consists of joint marketing agreements between Data General and third party software vendors. The catalog is organized into seven color-

coded sections referencing each of the major engineering markets; Manufacturing/Industrial Control, Architectural, Engineering and Construction, Mechanical Engineering, Electronic Engineering, Engineering Management and Analysis, and Engineering Utilities.
