Shopping Mall Proposed For End Of Computer Drive

The Westboro Zoning Board has approved a zoning variance so that a developer can build a shopping plaza at the end of Computer Drive on Flanders Road. The proposed layout calls for a two-story building to house four possible stores -- a convenience store, a video-rental store, a dry-cleaning store and a sub/pizza shop.

The proposal must also be approved by the Westboro Planning Board and the Board of Selectmen. Construction could begin later this spring.

Because of the traffic the mall would add to Computer Drive and Flanders Road, Data General, along with other businesses and residents in the area, has voiced its concern to the town. In a letter to Westboro's Zoning Board of Appeals, Public Affairs Director Brad Stroup wrote that "Rush-hour traffic at that intersection has been a serious problem for our employees for some time due to the development of the area. While the proposed shopping mall would add only a few vehicles, much of the traffic using the mall would come from employees in the area during rush-hours or at the times of greatest congestion.

"Data General has attempted to minimize our employee traffic in the area by providing added services within our office complex. Independent businesses now operate three restaurants and a drug store in our Computer Drive complex."

Data General Retires \$75 Million Debt

Data General will redeem its \$75 million 13 percent sinking fund debentures due 2005 on May 8, 1986 at a price equal to 109.10 percent of the aggregate principal amount of the debentures then outstanding plus accrued interest to the redemption date. No

further interest will accrue or be payable on the debentures on or after May 8, 1986.

Data General anticipates that the redemption shall result in an extraordinary charge before taxes of approximately \$7.6 million to its recently completed quarter ended March 29, 1986.

Data General Climbs Fortune Ladder

Fortune Magazine's list of the 500 largest U.S. industrial corporations by 1985 sales finds Data General at 269th. The company moved up 10 spots based on its revenues of \$1.239 billion.

Why Take A Chance

Office security starts with you. Let common sense be your guide. The following are some helpful hints for keeping your belongings secure.

- Do not leave your desk unlocked.
- If you do lock your desk, do not leave the key under the blotter.

When making hotel reservations only, employees should clearly note on their expense reports whether their arrangements were made by CTMS.

Field Engineering Policy Manual Goes On Line

Next week, Field Engineering's Policies and Procedures Manual will become available to authorized users worldwide via their computer terminals. Developed by the division's Policies and Procedures group along with its Management and Information Systems (MIS) department, the electronic manual will enhance productivity through CEO comprehensive electronic office capabilities.

Key features of the new electronic Field Engineering Policies and Procedures manual are:

- Accessible through the electronic mail function of CEO comprehensive electronic office software.
- Documents can be located in one of two ways: by entering the policy number (if known) or by searching for documents or categories of documents based on a wide variety of selection criteria.
- There is no need to file either printed or electronic copies of policies as the most up-to-date information is always available from the centralized, on-line library maintained by the Policies and Procedures group at Milford.

A brief message introducing the system soon will be forwarded to authorized users worldwide via CEO. Accompanying that message will be a document describing how to use the system and how to obtain additional help, if needed. Field Engineering locations not accessible through the CEO network will continue to receive paper copies of policies.

Says Tony Nicoletti, vice president of Field Engineering Support Services, "Such advances in office automation and end-user computing are key to further increases in our productivity and our ability to remain competitive in an ever-changing business environment. The proactive approach, design and implementation of this new system by Policies and Procedures and MIS is an example of what can be done by applying new tools to a paper environment."

April 25 Is Deadline For Changing Medical Coverage

The 1986 medical Open Enrollment period takes place during the month of April.

Open Enrollment is the one time during the year when employees may make the following changes to their medical coverage:

1. Add dependent coverage for their existing eligible dependents without proof of insurability;
2. Switch from a Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) to the Data General Medical Plan (Prudential);
3. Switch from the Data General Medical Plan to an HMO; or
4. Switch from one HMO to another HMO.

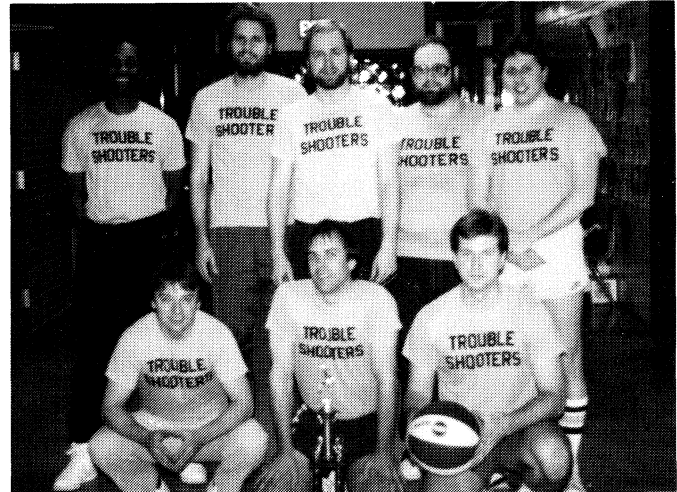
