Intersystems Corporation's "M," a market-leading systems software package combining an ANSI-standard MUMPS programming language with utilities and database software, will be available through the Data General Independent Software Vendor (ISV) program.

"M" is an ideal applications development package in environments which call for rapid programming, fast, reliable access to information, and ease of use.

Together with the integrated office automation capabilities offered by Data General's CEO Comprehensive Electronic Office software, it offers users in a variety of environments a total solution for business automation.

"M" will run on ECLIPSE MV/Family computers running Advanced Operating System/Virtual Storage (AOS/VS) software.

Data General's ISV program was established in 1983 and currently includes many software vendors that provide a wide variety of applications for the accounting, manufacturing, medical, government, ed-

ucation, legal and financial industries.

Intersystems Corporation of Boston, a leading international supplier of MUMPS software, installed the first ANSI-standard MUMPS system in 1977.

### Tim Webster Completes Marathon Run For MS

Running in a marathon is a mental test of endurance as well as a physical challenge. But the task takes on a whole new dimension when you are helping approximately 200 people a week fight a major disabling disease. That is the challenge Tim Webster, a senior interior designer and space planner at Data General-Westboro, met as he ran his first marathon to raise money for multiple sclerosis (MS).

Tim was one of the top five fundraisers for multiple sclerosis running in this year's Boston Marathon, raising more than \$1000 for the cause. He received the support of 100 friends who pledged money for the number of miles run to benefit multiple sclerosis.

"The race was extremely gratifying for me and I hope to do even better next year for multiple sclerosis. Experiencing the satisfaction of helping an

extremely good cause kept me going on that very hot day," comments Tim.

"At the 20-mile mark, I was actually about to throw in the towel when I saw a young women in a wheelchair sitting on the sidelines. I then began to think about people with MS, and completing the run became far more important to me than my own discomfort."


Tim has participated in the Boston Marathon as a qualified runner since 1978, running the 1985 race in three hours, thirty minutes.

Achieving this feat is no easy task. He runs about 35 miles a week in the off-season, and picks up the pace to 65-70 miles during the 10 weeks of training prior to marathon day. Proper training in long distance running prepares Tim to complete the race in good form and still be able to celebrate afterwards!

### **Employees Trained In Fire Safety**

When working around electrical equipment in a busy office, it pays to be trained in fire safety measures. More than 100 Data General-Westboro employees recently received hands-on fire extinguisher training conducted by Westboro Fire Safety Representative Ralph Mendall and Associate Safety Engineer Tony Gromelski.

The session featured demonstrations on the use of three different fire extinguishers followed by hands-on training on how to put out a fire.

"A pressurized water fire extinguisher, labelled 'A', is only for use on wood, cloth, paper or rubbish

fires," explains Tony. "These extinguishers contain water under pressure and are normally found in office settings where there may be heavy concentrations of paper. Water-type extinguishers should never be used on live electrical equipment fires because of the possibility of electrical shock.



"A carbon dioxide fire extinguisher, labelled 'BC', is for use on oil, gasoline, alcohol, flammable solvents and electrical equipment." Tony stresses that water extinguishers should never be used on fires of this sort. It would only cause them to spread.

"An 'ABC' dry chemical extinguisher is multi-purpose. It can be used on wood, cloth, paper, oil, gasoline and even equipment," he continues.

According to Tony, in the event of fire, employees should first notify Westboro Security at extension 6100, and then attempt to put out the fire following instructions. Grasp the extinguisher by the handle and base, remove from the wall and pull out the locking pin to release the hose from its retaining clip.

Carry the extinguisher as close to the fire as possible (15 feet or less), and direct fog or water to the base of the fire - slowly, in a back and forth motion - until extinguished.

"This type of training is a must in the event someone should encounter a fire," stresses Ralph. "Employees should remain calm, understand what is happening, and proceed to take the necessary fire safety measures."


