1986 Holiday Schedule

The 1986 Data General holiday schedule will include eight scheduled holidays and **TWO** personal holidays. The two personal holidays are available to each regular employee scheduled to work more than 20 hours a week, and hired before July 1, 1986.

Note: The 1985 holiday schedule included one personal holiday for regular employees hired before July 1, 1985. A personal holiday not taken before December 31, 1985, may not be carried over to the next calendar year. Also, if you leave the company you will not be entitled to pay in lieu of the holiday.

Data General Introduces 5.3 Gigabyte Disk Package

Data General has announced a 5.3 gigabyte (GB) disk package that offers its customers cost-effective mass storage for very large computer configurations.

Based on Data General's 592 megabyte (MB) Winchester-type disk subsystem, the Model 6350 Disk Package consists of nine 592 MB disks and

three intelligent disk controllers mounted in three meter-high peripheral cabinets.

Developed by Mass Storage Engineering, the Model 6350 Disk subsystem also is available packaged with the company's ECLIPSE MV/10000 mini-computer.

This disk package is especially suited for customers who require large amounts of on-line, high-performance storage. Mass Storage may represent as much as 50 percent of the total cost for a computer system, so savings can be significant in large system configurations.

The Model 6350 is priced at \$245,000; the special ECLIPSE MV/10000 packaged system is priced at \$470,094. Both are available immediately.

Through the business and marketing sessions and technical workshops, the conference will provide attendees with the tools, information, and ideas they need to plan their business and increase sales and profit.


Following registration on Sunday, a reception will give attendees the opportunity to renew old acquaintances and meet new system suppliers from around the world.

Texas A&M Receives MV / 10000 Donation



Data General donated computer equipment valued at more than \$675,000 to the Texas A&M University's department of computer science. Data General has donated computer equipment valued at more than \$675,000 to the Texas A&M University's department of computer science. The donation consists of an ECLIPSE MV / 10000 computer system, a DS / 4200 engineering workstation, two DATA GENERAL / One portable personal computers

and more than 20 graphics terminals as well as software and support.

The system will be used to enhance research and teaching in the department and will allow for further development of the university's Ada training programs. According to Professor Bart Childs, the donation will "more than double the current computing capacity of the computer science department."

"Texas A&M has been a leader in the development of Ada and Ada training programs, through its graduate and undergraduate courses and participation in the STARS program and SigAda. This donation will help the university further expand its efforts using the most technologically-advanced computer equipment," comments Phil Thomas, director of Federal Marketing in the Federal Systems Division.

To date, Data General has donated almost \$1 million in computer equipment to the school. Says Bruce McCormick, chairperson of the computer science department, "We have received more support from Data General than any other company in the computer industry."

Among those present at the dedication ceremony were more than 20 Data General employees who are Texas A&M alumni. Also in attendance was Stephanie Edwards, the Austin facility winner of Data General's \$1000 scholarship created in celebration of the company's first billion dollar year. Stephanie is currently enrolled as a freshman at Texas A&M.

life support providers. They recently earned their certification by completing the cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) course conducted by the Health Services department at Westboro. Employees learned how to save a choking victim, and administer one and two-person CPR on adults and infants.

CPR is serious business. When someone suffers cardiac arrest, immediate aid is essential. It can mean the difference between life and death. Health Services offers courses in CPR to promote health and safety awareness at Data General. The next course, consisting of four, two-hour sessions, will start on Tuesday, October 1. Information Management Solutions Selling Techniques

Marketing Education recently conducted the first offering of a new technical course designed to provide Data General Sales representatives and systems engineers with the skills to evaluate customer information requirements and determine appropriate solutions.

"Selling Information Management Solutions," a selling-level course on Data General's data management products, was held Tuesday, August 20 through Thursday, August 22 at Westboro. More than 20 employees from various Data General offices attended the course.

Key topics included determining customer needs and objectives for information management tools, and identifying the selling characteristics necessary for a successful information management sale. Information management concepts and the various types of Data General and ISV information management products available also were presented. Updating Your Address Is Not A One-Step Procedure

Employees are eligible for a wide variety of benefits and services from Data General, and updating all records to reflect a change of address is often a multi-step process. The following is a listing of whom to notify when your mailing address changes.

Changing Personnel and Payroll records:

If your paycheck does not reflect your correct address contact your supervisor, who will submit the change of address on your Employee Profile Document (EPD). Revising your EPD will update your Personnel records, thereby ensuring your receipt of important documents mailed by the company.

Changing your Auto, Homeowner's or Renter's Insurance record:

Contact Marsh & McLennan at extension 4603 in Westboro with change of address information. Marsh & McLennan does not have access to Data General Personnel records, so revised EPD information has no effect on their recordkeeping.

Union Warren Savings Bank or local savings bank/credit union:

Contact the savings bank or credit union directly for personal account records. Revised EPD information will not update the records maintained by these independent service institutions.

Stock Certificates:

Contact or write the transfer agent at Morgan Guaranty Trust, Operations Department, 30 West Broadway, New York, NY 10015. If you have more than one account, duplicate mailings may be avoided by requesting that Morgan Guaranty Trust consolidate your accounts. At the same time, provide them with the name and address to which all stockholders information should be mailed.

Benefits:

If your medical coverage is with an HMO contact your local Benefits administrator for an address change form. HMOs service specific geographic

locations, so a change of residence could effect your coverage. Your HMO requires your correct mailing address for medical records and home mailing purposes.

Remember:

While waiting for your records to be updated, guarantee mail forwarding by advising the Post Office of your new address.


