Scholarship Applications Due December 13

Friday, December 13 is the deadline for submitting applications for the 1987 Data General Scholarship Program. Each year Data General awards 10 scholarships to children of Data General employees. Children of full-time employees who will be graduating from high school in 1987 and plan to enter a U.S. college or university that same year are eligible. Applicants must have taken the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) given by all schools this past October.

Applications are available from your Personnel or Benefits office. Completed applications should be returned to the Corporate Benefits Office in Westboro at Mail Stop D138 no later than Friday, December 13.

TSD And Apex Manufacturing Cooperate For Trade Show Success

The Technical Systems Division (TSD) introduced Intermec Corporation as a new addition to Data General's Independent Hardware Vendor (IHV) Program at the Autofact (factory automation) trade show held recently at Cobo Hall in Detroit. Autofact is held once a year to enable vendors to exhibit their products, and keep up to date on the latest developments in computer-integrated manufacturing.

Intermec is the world's leading vendor of bar code data collection equipment, with a strong presence in Fortune 500 manufacturers including Data General. The Data General Manufacturing plant in Apex uses Intermec bar code equipment for a shipping and

order-tracking system developed by the Apex Management Information Systems (MIS) group, headed by Manager Susan Johnson.

TSD invited the Apex MIS group to Detroit to demonstrate its bar code shipping and order-tracking system in Data General's booth. Ellen Daniels and Don Brewer, two key developers of the system, polished the demo system at Apex before bringing it to the show. Ellen and Don not only got the system up and running on the ECLIPSE MV/10000 system in the booth, but also integrated Intermec's portable bar code laser scanner into the system. This allowed for scanned bar codes to be processed by the ECLIPSE MV/10000 system.

Don and Ellen spent three full days at the show explaining the system to the manufacturing engineering professionals who stopped by the booth. Their demonstration was a success, as it provided them with new ideas for process application at the Apex plant.

"The efforts of our Manufacturing group in Apex helped make Autofact a very successful show," explains Rod Griffith, factory automation marketing specialist in TSD. "Not only did it enable us to show a real solution running on the ECLIPSE MV/10000, but the fact that Don and Ellen had implemented the system at a Data General Manufacturing plant established its credibility with the show visitors, most of whom were from similar manufacturing environments."

Show attendance this year reached a record high of 22,000. The Intermec bar code data collection exhibit was one of several computer-integrated manufacturing applications demonstrated at Data General's booth, which included solutions from various other third-party software and hardware vendors as well.

BU Interactive Video Courses At Westboro

Corporate Management and Organizational Development (M.O.D.) is sponsoring a set of Boston University (BU) engineering and computer science courses delivered through BU's Interactive Network. The classes are given on campus at BU, but televised live at Data General-Westboro and other companies.

A brief presentation on the BU program by Dr. Louis Padulo, dean of the College of Engineering, followed by a question and answer session will be held on Thursday, December 12 from 9:30 a.m. to 10 a.m. in the Engineering Training Room, located near the main cafeteria across from Mail Stop C138. Dean Padulo will then be available for individual academic

counselling from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. Registration for spring courses can be done at that time, or at a separate registration session to be held at Data General on Monday, January 6.

Video courses can be taken on a special student basis or as part of a formal BU degree program. Tuition is \$1896 for a four-credit course and \$948 for a two-credit course. Payment can be reimbursed through Data General's Educational Assistance Program. The course list for the Spring 1986 semester will be available through M.O.D. by early December.

OIS Demo In Guest Marketing

Data General Field Engineering recently implemented a new On-Line Information Service (OIS) for its DATA GENERAL / One portable personal computer and DESKTOP GENERATION system dealers and customers nationwide. A demonstration of OIS will take place today in Guest Marketing Room 10, from 12 noon to 4:30 p.m.

Available 24 hours-a-day, OIS offers the most current product, support and maintenance information on both the DATA GENERAL / One and DESKTOP GENERATION systems. Among the many features available are: dealer newsletters; tips and techniques; technical information; compatibility issues; hardware issues reporting; Software Trouble Report (STR) submission, and a software directory.

A major feature of OIS is DG TALK, an interactive "bulletin board" feature that enables the user to submit queries to Data General product specialists. DG TALK allows users to submit both STRs and hardware issues, and receive responses within 48 hours.

New Catalog Describes Employee Training Programs

Data General employees who want to enhance their technical skills can do so through an expanded employee training program offered by Educational Services. A new 20-page catalog details the training opportunities available to employees. Over 75 software, CEO Comprehensive Electronic Office and hardware maintenance classes are regularly conducted at six training facilities across the United States. All of these courses are open to employees who wish to enroll, upon supervisor's approval.

According to Employee Training Manager Betty Anne Davis, "Although we have always trained a substantial number of Data General employees, it was apparent that many were not aware of the scope of the specialized training that we can offer. The new catalog details our technical training program, and will help alert employees to the educational opportunities available to them internally."

Several types of training programs are offered by Educational Services. Classroom courses are held weekly at Data General's six U.S. training facilities, located in Westboro (at 2400 Computer Drive) and in Atlanta, Chicago, Los Angeles, San Francisco and Washington DC. As Betty Anne points out, "Educational Services can provide a variety of technical training programs, depending upon the specific needs of the department. Our instructors can conduct courses from our standard curriculum or modify a course at the request of a particular group."

She adds, "When a department requests training in an area that is not part of our standard curriculum, we can work with the group and their Management and Organizational Development representative to adapt a course to their requirements."

New Course Teaches CEOWrite

A new three-day course on CEOWrite will be held at the Education Center, 2400 Computer Drive, starting on Tuesday, December 17. Conducted by Educational Services exclusively for Data General employees, this course is a workshop that presents the features, terms and functions of the CEOWrite word processor and its CEO CONNECTION to a host computer system.

CEOWrite and the CEO CONNECTION (OA 154) will teach you how to use CEOWrite to: create, edit and print documents; generate a glossary and table of contents; create headers and footers; number pages and paragraphs; manipulate columns; use split screen editing; reformat text; do list processing; customize the system profile; and create USER COMMANDS.

To enroll, call extension 4079 in Westboro. Class size is limited, so call today to reserve your place in class. Supervisor's approval is required.

In addition to classroom training at the Education Centers, courses can be conducted at most Data General facilities. Employees also can take advantage of self-study training packages and Computer-Based Training courses. A complete list of these training products is included in the new catalog.
