Marketing Agreement Made With Concord Data Systems

Data General has signed an Independent Hardware Marketing agreement with Concord Data Systems, a Marlboro, Mass.-based supplier of manufacturing automation protocol (MAP) -compatible local area network systems. As a result, Data General systems will be able to communicate over IEEE 802.4 token-bus broadband networks by means of Concord communications controllers.

"The new marketing agreement is part of a program to support and broaden our commitment to offer a range of industry standard communications

capabilities," says Don McDougall, vice president of the Technical Systems Division. "The requirement for MAP, which is based on the 802.4 standard, is growing in importance as a means to integrate automation capabilities on the factory floor.

"Over the longer term, our program includes development of integrated MAP hardware and software communications products for the ECLIPSE MV/Family of processors and enhancements to our XODIAC communications software to include full MAP/TOP compatibility. These products will be available in 1987," adds Don.

Concord Data Systems designs, manufactures and markets MAP-compatible local area network products that connect industrial automation systems on the plant floor into a single, integrated manufacturing system. Concord Data is a leading supplier of MAP-compatible products with 5,000 connections in over 100 manufacturing plant sites around the world.

Symposium Recognizes Innovative Excellence

The symposium, on "Operational and Technical Excellence in Manufacturing," was held recently at Data General-Portsmouth.

Lester, Richard and Franck co-authored "Determination Of Argus Carriage Bearing Angles, Utilizing A Laser System." John submitted a paper titled "Soldering Of Surface Mounted Connectors." These entries were chosen by symposium participants as the best of the 35 papers submitted in response to a "call for papers" issued to Data General's New England Manufacturing plants.

The authors of the top papers each will receive a DATA GENERAL/One portable personal computer, complete with 512K memory; LOTUS 1-2-3, CEOWrite, and CEO comprehensive electronic office Connection software packages; a printer and a modem.

Eric took third place honors with his paper titled "Contamination In Disk Drives And Its Removal Using Shear Stress Clean."

According to Tracey Zellmann, director of Advanced Manufacturing Engineering and Technology, "The symposium represents the community and sharing of innovative ideas within Manufacturing. The proposals are recognized for their innovation and their contribution to the business. I consider them all winners."

This year's symposium was regionalized in order to encourage the active involvement of all employees at Data General's Manufacturing facilities throughout the United States. Employees were invited to submit original and creative ideas that have the potential to make a significant contribution to Manufacturing operations.

Papers were submitted to peer groups on the first day of the Region 1 symposium. A judging staff comprised of directors and plant managers chose 11 semi-finalists for final presentations. On the following day, regional finalists were then chosen from this group of presenters.

The top three presentations were video-taped, and those tapes currently are available for viewing at the Manufacturing Technology Institute (MTI) in Westboro. In addition, the top three papers will be presented at the Manufacturing Management Conference scheduled for the fall.

Day Kimball Hospital Receives Company Support

Data General has contributed \$7,000 to the Day Kimball Hospital in Putnam, Conn. to help the hospital purchase a computerized patient monitoring system for its Intensive Care Unit.

The sophisticated monitoring equipment will provide constant readings of a patient's vital signs, such as cardiac and fluid output, arrhythmia detection, and blood pressure. Using this equipment, doctors and nurses will be able to retrieve, analyze

and predict trends on a critical patient's status. They also will be able to monitor each patient's heart beat by remote control.

The Day Kimball Hospital is the only medical facility of its kind in the vicinity of Data General-Woodstock. It provides quality health care and services for Data General employees and their families living, working or attending training sessions in the northeastern Connecticut area.

High blood pressure is a silent, often mysterious killer. If hypertension is not controlled, serious cardiovascular complications may result. Stroke, congestive heart failure and kidney failure are just a few of the conditions evoked by hypertension.

High blood pressure is a leading cause of disease and death in this country. According to the American

Heart Association, one in six adults has some elevation of blood pressure. Approximately half of those individuals with high blood pressure are not aware that they have it. The American Heart Association states, "High blood pressure can be detected by a simple test. Once diagnosed, effective treatment now is available. High blood pressure is treatable."

Training

Learn At Your Own Pace With Computer-Based Courses

Marketing Education has made available computer-based training (CBT) courses that offer a convenient way for Data General Sales representatives, systems engineers and other employees to get the training needed to effectively carry out their responsibilities.

With CBT, a computer delivers and administers courses in field locations. The courses are self-paced, allowing employees to work at their own rate. They also are interactive, with helpful feedback offered throughout the course. And, the training is individualized, providing instruction as employees require it.

The first course, called "User Device Interconnections," is an introductory data communications

course designed for Sales representatives and systems engineers. It covers basic data communications concepts including types of data communications systems, basic components, data communications hardware and standards. The final module describes features of Data General user device interconnection products such as USAM, IAC, MCP1 and CPI/24, as well as terminal and printer connection schemes and interface comparisons.

The course is a prerequisite for any upper level data communications course delivered in Marketing Education. It is also mandatory for all Marketing and Systems trainees (MST) during module three of their curriculum. In addition, all Corporate Sales and Systems Orientation (CSSO) class participants should review the course as part of their preparatory package before attending CSSO at Woodstock.

User Device Interconnections is designed to be delivered on a DESKTOP GENERATION Model 10/SP computer with color graphics. Marketing Education has made an agreement with Field Engineering that allows North American Sales Division (NASD) employees to use its DESKTOP GENERATION Model 10/SPs, dedicated to training, in more than 80 locations across the country as well as Canada. Alternately, if NASD employees already have a DESKTOP GENERATION system in their office, the appropriate software is available from the Area Technical Support Group managers.
