Data General And Fairchild Settle Litigation

Data General and Fairchild Semiconductor have settled all litigation between them. The litigation concerned trade secret and antitrust claims asserted by the parties relative to computer products.

According to Data General President Ed de Cas, "We are very pleased to have this litigation, which began in 1977, behind us. The burden to the company in terms of legal fees, officers' time and other associated costs is over. Now we can focus our entire energy and efforts on winning more business in the marketplace with the new generation of products that have been so well received by our customers."

The settlement will result in a pre-tax charge of \$52.5 million and an after-tax charge of \$29.4 million, or approximately \$1.10 per share in the quarter ending September 27. The terms of the settlement are confidential by agreement.

New Manufacturing Assignments; Erdekian Named Vice President

Last Outing Of The Season Is This Weekend




