### Data General Presents "Picture Of Health"



*"The Picture Of Health" was the theme of the Data General exhibit (shown above) at the American Hospital Association annual convention, which was held recently in Georgia. Data General illustrated its leadership in hospital technology by demonstrating for the first time its specialized hospital bedside terminal created exclusively for the health-care industry. Data General also introduced a new presentation called "CEO In Healthcare," which features the way CEO comprehensive electronic office software is used in hospitals. To highlight the exhibit, Health Data Sciences (HDS) demonstrated the hospital bedside terminal developed by Data General for use with the HDS ULTICARE software. ULTICARE is an innovative bedside-based hospital information system which improves the quality of patient care and shortens hospital stays. The system saves a nurse one to two hours of clerical work each day.*

Data General demonstrated products resulting from the company's development and marketing agreement with Gold Hill Computers. This relationship makes available the only network-based expert system running on a personal computer linked to a minicomputer.

The product developed by Gold Hill Computers is GoldWorks, an expert system development and delivery tool. This tool, which runs on a DASHER/286 workstation, accesses an ECLIPSE MV system through Data General's DG/PC\*I networking product and Gold Hill's Golden Connection. This unique combination allows knowledge-based expert systems to access corporate databases.

One of the demonstrations was an application developed by Maureen Immes and Maurine Hennings of the Information Management Group (IMG), Roger Banks and Bill Lahti from RTP and Yehudah Freundlich and Steve Petrofsky from the Artificial Intelligence Marketing group. This expert system, a Transfer Pricing module, allows a finance department to easily and accurately update its pricing policy for products.

According to Pete Doonan, a manager within IMG, "The combination of GoldWorks and DG/PC\*I provides a powerful set of tools to bring the technologies associated with artificial intelligence into the hands of MIS professionals to solve real business concerns."

### Caruso Named Director For Technology / Corporate Quality

*John Caruso* has been named director of Technology and Corporate Quality. He reports to Lee Henning, vice president of Central Manufacturing Services. John will be responsible for planning manufacturing processes to be implemented at Data General plants around the world.

John has been with Data General for nine years. For the past year, he was director of Manufacturing within the Volume Products Division, based in Durham. Prior to that, John was the Disk and File Operations manager at Westbrook since 1982. He joined Data General in 1978 as a Human Resources manager. Before joining

## Training

Educational Services is offering the following courses in August and September. Prior approval of your supervisor is required for course registration. Call (tie line) 221-1647 to enroll in these classes or other classes. All classes are held at the Education Center at 2400 Computer Drive in Westboro.

- **Getting Started with PRESENT (OA 145)** - This course is for employees who want to organize and manipulate numerical data for effective business decision planning and administrative support. Familiarity with the CEO system would be helpful to attend this one-day class being held on Friday, August 28.
- **COBOL Programming with INFOS II (S107)** - COBOL programmers will learn how to write programs in ANSI '74 COBOL with the INFOS II file maintenance system for ECLIPSE commercial systems. Employees should have taken S209 (AOS and AOS/VS User) to attend this five-day course which begins on Monday, August 31.
- **CEOWrite and CEO CONNECTION (OA154)** - This workshop will acquaint employees with the features, terms and functions of the CEOWrite word processor and its CEO CONNECTION to a host computer system. CEO word processor experience and typewriter key-

board experience is needed to take this three-day class starting on Tuesday, September 8.

- **ECLIPSE MV/Family Assembly Language Programming (S105/VS)** - Learn how to write, assemble, execute, and debug programs using the ECLIPSE MV/Family assembly language and utilities. The prerequisites of S209 (AOS and AOS/VS User) and assembly language programming experience are needed to attend this five-day class. The class begins on Monday, September 14.
- **CEO System Manager (S221)** - Some of the topics discussed in this course will be CEO installations, system startup and shutdown, mail system and word processor support functions, queue manager functions, configuration, printing issues and system maintenance. Employees taking this course must have thorough knowledge of CEO from a user's perspective and S209 (AOS & AOS/VS User), SH109/VS (AOS/VS Operator Training) or equivalent experience. This three-day class starts on Monday, September 14.
- **WordPerfect Word Processing (OA 180)** - This three-day course teaches the features of the WordPerfect word processor and how to install it. Editing, merges, formatting, and using the HELP function are just a few of the topics which will be discussed in this class which begins on Monday, September 21.
- **Overview of Data Communications Concepts (S140)** - No experience in data communications is needed to attend this two-day course which introduces the components of a modern data communications system. Transmission of data, transmission hardware, network concepts and topologies are a few of the topics discussed in this one-day course. The class will start Monday, September 21.
- **AOS/VS Operator Training (SH109/VS)** - AOS/VS system operators will learn effective operation of AOS/VS-based system which includes startup, shutdown, monitoring, creating macros, error recovery and communicating with the operating system using CLI. Employees who have taken S100 (Computer Concepts) or have a functional knowledge of computer concepts are eligible for this five-day course which starts on Monday, September 21.
- **AOS and AOS/VS User (S209)** - This class teaches how to use the AOS and AOS/VS operating systems. Building and using disc files and directories, and using the Command Line Interpreter (CLI) interactively or through programmed macros are just some of the topics discussed in this five-day course beginning on Monday, September 28.
- **Artificial Intelligence: A Programmer's Guide (SM502)** - This seminar will help participants understand the basic techniques of Artificial Intelligence (AI). Learn from AI programs that solve engineering problems, reason about assemblies, and engage in English discourse. Also, included is an introduction to robotics and vision. This three-day course, which starts on Wednesday, September 2, will be taught by Dr. Lozano-Perez, an associate professor of computer science at MIT.

• **AOS/VS Asynchronous Communications (SM527)** - This seminar describes AOS/VS structures that support asynchronous comms and explores how users can customize this interface. Standard Data General devices are used to illustrate AOS/VS data tables and the distribution of support responsibilities among system code and application programs. It includes adding non-standard terminals to ASO/VS. Class starts on Monday, August 31 and runs for two days.

• **RDOS to AOS/VS System Programming Conversion (SM522)** - This seminar compares the RDOS dual ground multitasking environment to the AOS/VS multi-process multitasking environment, addressing the system generation and system programming issues. Employees must have completed S304 (RDOS System Programming) and S209 (AOS/VS User) to participate in this five-day course beginning on Monday, September 21.

## Benefits

### Savings And Investment Plan Update

Whether you are currently participating in the Savings and Investment Plan, or planning to enroll on October 1, you should be aware of upcoming plan deadlines.

#### **Plan Eligibility**

If you will have completed 90 days of employment before October 1, you will be eligible to join the Savings and Investment Plan effective October 1.

A packet of descriptive material will be mailed to the homes of eligible employees by the first week of September. If you qualify as a recent new hire and do not receive this information, contact your Benefits administrator or Human Resources representative.

After reading the information, simply complete the enrollment form and submit it to your Benefits or Human Resources representative. If you decide not to contribute to the plan at this time, you will be able to enroll at the start of the next quarter in January 1988.

#### **Fund Transfers**

Participants in the Savings and Investment Plan can transfer all, or part, of their account balance from any investment fund(s) to any other investment fund(s) at the start of any calendar quarter. However, a transfer cannot be made more than once every six months (every other quarter).

If you would like to transfer funds for the calendar quarter beginning October 1, you must complete the Fund Transfer portion of the Savings and Investment Enrollment/Change form and return it to the Benefits

department in Westboro no later than Friday, September 18. All transfers will become effective October 1.

The transfer of funds will not affect your future contributions. If your intention is to have all contributions after October 1 directed to a different fund or funds you must also complete the Investment Election portion of the form.

Enrollment/Change forms are available from your Human Resources representative, local Benefits department or the corporate Benefits department in Westboro.

#### **Enrollment And Change Deadlines**

**Friday, September 1**, is the deadline for submitting all new enrollments and quarterly contribution changes to the Savings and Investment Plan. The enrollment forms (used for new enrollments, changes and fund transfers) must be returned to your local Benefits department by Friday, September 18, for enrollments/changes effective October 1.

#### **Ceasing Contributions**

As a reminder, you may cease making contributions to the Savings and Investment Plan (through payroll deduction) and become a non-contributing participant at any time during the quarter by submitting an enrollment form accordingly. You may start contributing again effective the beginning of any given quarter by completing the enrollment form as indicated. Non-contributing participants may still utilize the loan, hardship, and age 59 1/2 withdrawal provisions of the plan as long as participants meet all necessary requirements. For instance, in order to take out a loan you must have a minimum balance of \$500 in your Savings and Investment account, whether or not you are still contributing.

#### **Reminder: Loan Deadlines**

Loan applications must be received by the last day of the month to be processed and for a check to be issued by the third week of the following month. For example, if you wish to take out a loan and receive the money by the end of October, you must submit the Loan Application and the Security and Disclosure form by September 30.

#### **Whom To Contact**

If you have any questions regarding the plan, contact your local Benefits administrator or corporate Benefits department in Westboro.

### Have You Filled Out Your New W-4 Or W-4A?

The Tax Reform Act of 1986 requires that a new W-4 or W-4A be submitted to employers no later than October 1, 1987. Failure to comply with the law can

result in a higher federal withholding. If a new W-4 or W-4A form is not submitted to a Data General Payroll site by October 1, the Payroll departments are required to alter employee exemptions according to the law. The law states that "if a new form W-4 or W-4A is not submitted, the employer must withhold if the employee is single, claiming one withholding allowance, or married claiming two withholding allowances, depending on whether the employee checked the single or married box on the most recent W-4 on file with the employer."

Employees can obtain W-4 and W-4A forms at the Payroll department. Should you need assistance filling out either form, the IRS, through its Taxpayer Service, can help answer your questions and provide you with additional information.

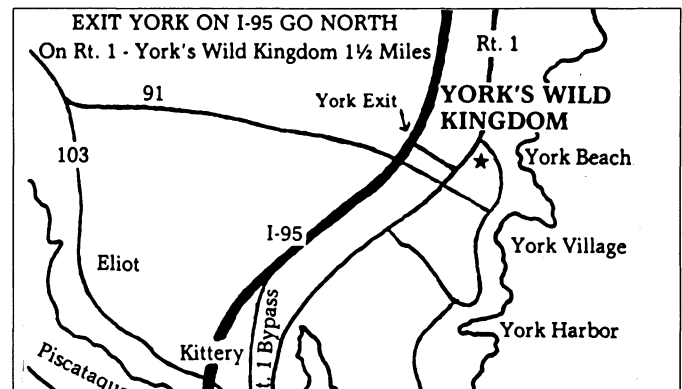

For Fall Dasher Races**

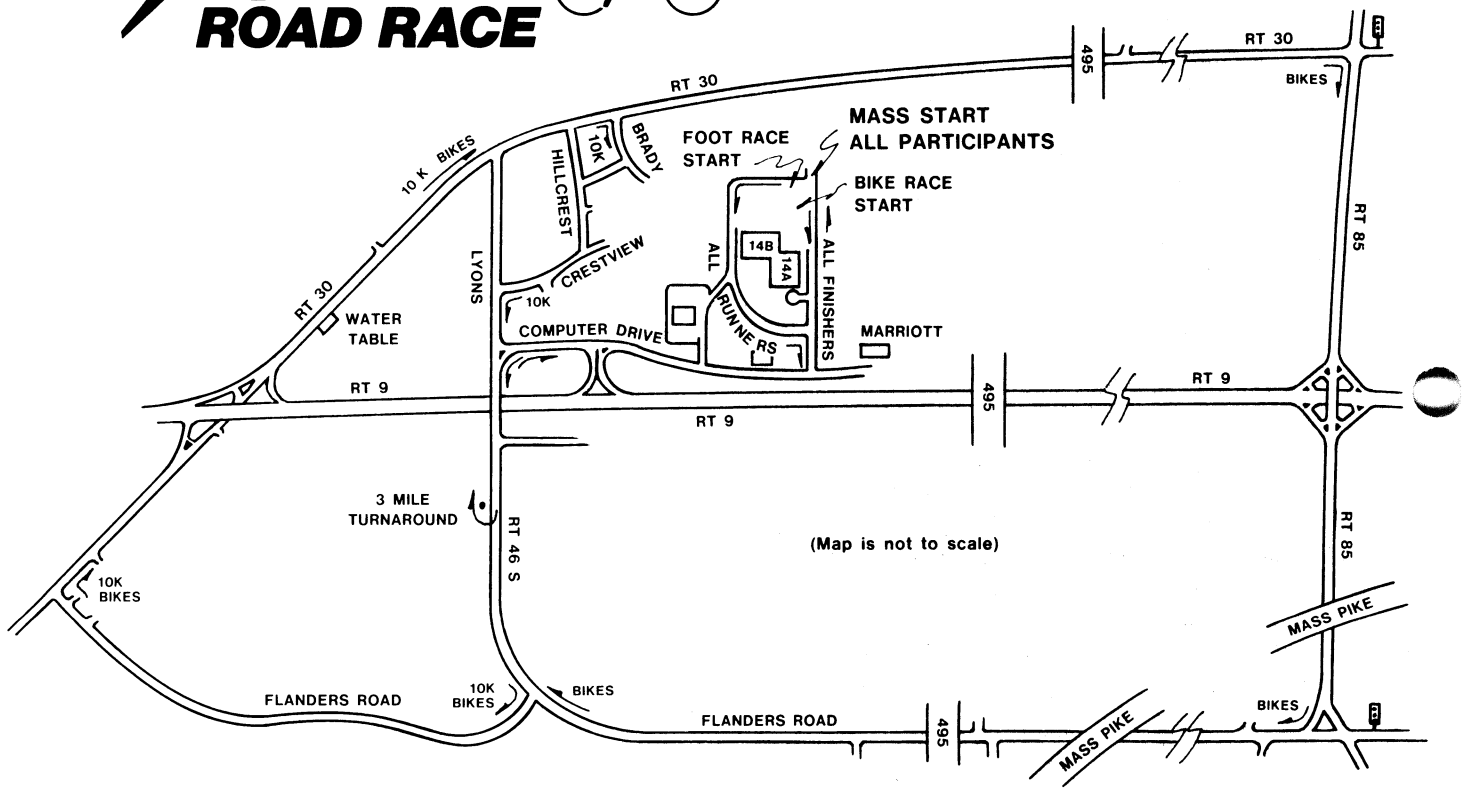
